Looking at the top of this year's high school rankings, schools like St. Cuthbert's, Kristin, ACG Parnell, Pinehurst and Rangi Ruru actively encourage students to push themselves far beyond what they believe to be possible, seize the opportunities available to them and chase their most ambitious goals.

ABOUT THE 2024 RANKINGS

This year brings the sixth consecutive release of the Top 50 New Zealand High Schools for Gaining Admission to the World's Top Universities by Crimson Education, the world's leading university admissions firm and one of New Zealand's most-successful startups. The list draws on Crimson's 10 years of experience supporting Kiwi students to gain admission to universities like Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, Duke, Johns Hopkins, Oxford and Cambridge.

For Kiwi families, the choice of high school is critical to a student's long-term success. In creating the 2024 rankings, bricks-and-mortar high schools from across New Zealand were evaluated in the context of global education and university admissions trends.

Schools were assessed on the basis of Academic Performance, Extracurricular and Leadership Opportunities, and Access and Diversity — three factors which significantly impact Kiwi students' chances of gaining admission to and thriving at the world's top universities.

Congratulations to St. Cuthbert's College for claiming the top position in this year's rankings. St. Cuthbert's has a notable track record for placing their students at top universities, including four students who accepted offers to Oxford and Cambridge in the 2022/2023 application round.

Single-sex girls' schools dominated this year's Top 10, with St. Cuthbert's College, Diocesan School for Girls, Rangi Ruru Girls' High School and Woodford House taking out 1st, 5th, 8th and 9th place, respectively. Of the Top 10, 8 schools offered an international education qualification — either the Cambridge International A-Levels or the International Baccalaureate (IB).

Auckland Grammar School entered the Top 10 for the first time this year, recognising their students' considerable achievements in the Cambridge International Examinations, including 7 Top in the World results. Rangi Ruru Girls' School also entered this year's Top 10 after two students received admission to Stanford and Princeton — an incredible accomplishment.

HOW THE RANKINGS ARE CALCULATED

In creating the 2024 rankings, Crimson's team of data scientists evaluated New Zealand high schools on the basis of the following criteria:

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE (70%)

Academic Performance was assessed based on publicly available data, and weighted the NCEA, NZQA, IB and CIE curricula equally. Data was drawn from the 2022 academic year, as results from 2023 were not readily available at time of publication (this is consistent with previous years). This criterion also considered the number of national academic awards received by students (e.g. NZQA Scholarships).

EXTRACURRICULARS AND LEADERSHIP (15%)

Extracurricular and Leadership Opportunities were evaluated on the breadth and depth of activities available to students, such as the clubs and competitions they can participate in, athletic and performing arts programs, and study-abroad experiences. 2022/23 admission results to Ivy League and other top universities were also considered in evaluating this criterion, as these universities place strong emphasis on extracurricular involvement and leadership when admitting Kiwi students.

ACCESS AND DIVERSITY (15%)

Access and Diversity was assessed based on the makeup of the school's student population, including the processes and practices implemented to drive positive access outcomes (e.g. merit and needs-based scholarships offered). This criterion was included in our evaluation of New Zealand high schools, as learning in a diverse environment is critical in equipping students with the interpersonal skills necessary to thrive on global university campuses.
