A MESSAGE FROM CRIMSON'S CO-FOUNDER

As New Zealand's education landscape evolves, this year's high school rankings provide a critical insight into the performance and adaptability of top institutions. Designed to guide Kiwi families and international parents, these rankings highlight the schools shaping the next generation of leaders. Education remains a key driver of New Zealand's long-term productivity, global competitiveness, and prosperity, making it vital to celebrate schools that consistently raise the bar.

This year, the dominance of global curricula like the International Baccalaureate (IB) and A Levels is more apparent than ever. These internationally recognised programs equip students with the academic foundation, research skills, and global perspectives required by the world's top universities. Schools offering these programs continue to lead, with St. Cuthbert's College, ACG Parnell and Kristin School achieving exceptional results. Meanwhile, NCEA schools produce strong outcomes, though the lack of an internationally recognised benchmark presents a challenge for students applying abroad. Despite this, schools like Auckland Grammar, Baradene College, and Rangitoto College continue to excel, securing top academic honours.

Beyond academics, holistic education is key. New Zealand's top students are excelling in research, leadership, and extracurriculars, from launching startups to competing in global Olympiads. St. Cuthbert's College retained its top position, with 20% of students achieving IB scores of 40+ and two earning 44/45. Kristin saw 36% of IB candidates achieve 40+, while ACG Parnell secured 14 Top-in-the-World and 18 Top-in-

This year's rankings also reflect greater diversity in pathways to success. Schools fostering inclusive student communities are gaining recognition, exemplified by Māori students securing early admissions to Princeton and Duke. Public schools like Rangitoto College continue to rise, breaking into the top 10 for the second year running.

As global admissions grow more competitive, these rankings offer a clear, data-driven perspective on the schools best preparing students for success.

ABOUT THE 2025 RANKINGS

This year marks the seventh annual release of Crimson Education's Top 50 New Zealand High Schools for Gaining Admission to the World's Top Universities. As the world's leading university admissions firm and one of New Zealand's most successful startups, Crimson draws on over a decade of experience helping Kiwi students secure places at renowned institutions like Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, Duke, Johns Hopkins, Oxford, and Cambridge and more.

For Kiwi families, choosing the right high school is a crucial step in shaping a student's long-term success. Like previous years the 2025 Top 50 Schools Ranking methodology evaluates brick-and-mortar high schools across New Zealand in the context of global education and university admissions trends.

Schools were assessed based on Academic Performance, Extracurricular and Leadership Opportunities, and Access and Diversity; three critical factors that significantly influence Kiwi students' ability to gain admission to and excel at the world's leading universities.

Congratulations to St. Cuthbert's College, ACG Parnell, Kristin School, Pinehurst School, and Diocesan School for Girls for securing the top five spots in this year's rankings. These schools have nurtured students who gained admission to prestigious universities such as Harvard, Brown, UPenn, Columbia, Cambridge, LSE, Imperial, Oxford, King's College London, and more during the 2023/24 admissions cycle.

As the 2024/25 admissions cycle continues to demonstrate high admission rates for Kiwi students to top-ranked universities, we are incredibly proud to be associated with several prestigious schools across Aotearoa.

With impressive admissions results across the board, this list provides valuable insights into the schools leading the way in helping Kiwi students succeed and thrive on the global stage.

HOW THE RANKINGS ARE CALCULATED

In creating the 2025 rankings, Crimson's team of data scientists evaluated New Zealand high schools on the basis of the following criteria:

ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE (70%)

Academic Performance was assessed based on publicly available data, and weighted the NCEA, NZQA, IB and CIE curricula equally. Data was drawn from the 2023 academic year, as results from 2024 were not readily available at time of publication (this is consistent with previous years). This criterion also considered the number of national academic awards received by students (e.g. NZQA Scholarships).

EXTRACURRICULARS AND LEADERSHIP (15%)

Extracurricular and Leadership Opportunities were evaluated on the breadth and depth of activities available to students, such as the clubs and competitions they can participate in, athletic and performing arts programs, and study-abroad experiences. 2024/25 admission results to lvy League and other top universities were also considered in evaluating this criterion, as these universities place strong emphasis on extracurricular involvement and leadership when admitting Kiwi students.

ACCESS AND DIVERSITY (15%)

Access and Diversity was assessed based on the makeup of the school's student population, including the processes and practices implemented to drive positive access outcomes (e.g. merit and needs-based scholarships offered). This criterion was included in our evaluation of New Zealand high schools, as learning in a diverse environment is critical in equipping students with the interpersonal skills necessary to thrive on global university campuses.
